

Be it resolved by the Legislature of Puerto Rico:

Section 1.—The sum of thirty-seven thousand (37,000) dollars is hereby appropriated to the Culebra Conservation and Development Authority from unencumbered funds in the Commonwealth Treasury, for the construction and improvement of recreational facilities in Flamenco Beach in Culebra.

Section 2.—The Executive Director of the Culebra Conservation and Development Authority is hereby authorized to accept, on behalf of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, all contributions of money from citizens, private enterprises, state agencies or from the Government of the United States, that in his judgment, are necessary for the purposes stated in this Joint Resolution.

Section 3.—This Joint Resolution shall take effect July 1, 1989.

JOINT RESOLUTION	

Section 2.—Whenever the interest of the service so requires it, the Governor, or the Director of the Budget and Management Office by his delegation, may authorize the transfer of amounts among the appropriation items in the budget of the same body of the Government of Puerto Rico, including the contributions provided to Government Enterprises; it being understood that for appropriation items not only the appropriations contained in this Joint Resolution, but also the appropriation items approved in the budgetary details that by provision of Act No. 147 of June 18, 1980, are approved by the Budget and Management Office. For the application of the above provided, the Office of the Governor, the Budget and Management Office, the Planning Board, the Office of Youth Affairs, the Commonwealth Office of Civil Rescue, the Commission for the Protection and Strengthening of the Family in Puerto Rico, the Environmental Quality Board, the Economic Opportunity Office, the Energy Office of Puerto Rico, the Commission on Women's Affairs, the Senior Citizens Affairs Office, the Education and Employment Governing Board, the Office of the Disabled Persons Investigating Official, the Corps of Volunteer in the Service of Puerto Rico and the Commonwealth Office of Historic Preservation shall be deemed as a single fiscal unit. Provided, that the items consigned as Donations to Private Organizations for educational, social well being, health, legal aid purposes and others of similar nature shall not be transferred to the

items for regular expenses of the government bodies that administer said donations. In all cases, the officials that apply for said transfers shall submit to the Governor or the employee or official designated by him the information to justify them. The previous provisions shall not be applicable to the transfers among the appropriation items of the Legislature, nor to the appropriation items of the General Court of Justice.

The balances or remainders of the appropriations made in this resolution that have not been bound prior to June 30, 1990, shall be cancelled in the manner provided by the law within the six months following the termination of the fiscal year, or in that later date that the Secretary of the Treasury so provides.

The salaries of employees and officials shall be paid in accordance with the provisions of the "Uniform Compensation Act", or of any uniform compensation plan approved by this Legislature in the future, and pursuant to the Rules and Regulations of the Central Personnel Administration Office, chargeable to the appropriations set aside in this Joint Resolution for the departments and agencies, or from any other appropriations authorized for such purposes.

Section 3.—The agencies are hereby empowered, with the approval of the Governor or the official designated by him, to enter into agreements with other agencies and/or municipalities for the rendering of services on the basis of contracting or matching of municipal funds and those appropriated in this Resolution.

Section 4.—The Director of the Office of the Budget and Management and the Secretary of the Treasury are hereby empowered to establish special accounts and authorize the advancing of funds drawn against said accounts, for the payment of services rendered by the Electric Power Authority, the Aqueduct and Sewers Authority, the Telephone Authority, the Communications Authority, the Public Buildings Authority and the Printing and Transportation Services of the General Services Administration.

The public corporations and enterprises providing services to the Government shall be under the obligation to submit all bills and statements of account speedily and efficiently, and of the agencies using such services, to diligently verify and arrange for the payment of the bills received. The Department of the Treasury shall see to it that the agencies as well as the public corporations, using them, shall establish the necessary procedures to liquidate the services billed against the accounts and advances established speedily and properly.

The Secretary of the Treasury is also empowered to make adjustments between the accounts, obligations and advances of funds of the different agencies, and to withhold funds from said accounts to ensure the prompt payment of public services.

Section 5.—Norms for the Management of Donations Appropriated to Entities

Any Department, Agency of public instrumentality under whose custody the donations consigned herein are appropriated, shall be obliged to confirm the necessity of the government appropriation hereby granted, and through the necessary regulations and supervision, shall see to it that the entity favored with a donation, uses it for the purposes requested. A copy of these regulations must be submitted to the Committees on the Treasury of the Senate of Puerto Rico and of the House of Representatives.

Said regulations shall contain a clause to the effects that every person or entity to whom a donation has been appropriated through this Joint Resolution, shall comply with the following norms, among others:

(a) To submit an itemized schedule of expenses according to the use to be given to the donation within thirty (30) days after the beginning of the fiscal year.

(b) To keep a control and accounting system of the donation funds according to recognized public accounting rules.

(c) To deposit the donation moneys in a special bank account set aside from any other funds or resources of the entity. At least two (2) signatures shall be required to draw against said account and the name, address and signature of those persons shall be notified to the agency under which custody the donation has been appropriated and to the Committees on Treasury of the Senate of Puerto Rico and the House of Representatives.

(d) The director or administrator of the entity may not act as its fiscal agent at the same time. The entity shall designate a fiscal agent who shall be in charge of receiving, accounting and reimbursing money, as well as in keeping all the vouchers and related fiscal documents.

(e) Disbursements shall only be made through check and for the payment of expenses directly related to the purposes for which the donation was appropriated, as stated in the application documents submitted to the Legislature.

(f) No cashier's checks shall be drawn, and no cash payments chargeable to the donation shall be made.

(g) A detailed semi-annual report of the expenses incurred, chargeable to this donation, shall be filed in the agency under whose custody the donation has been appropriated and in the Committees on Treasury of the Senate and the House of Representatives.

(h) All the checks, invoices, purchase orders and payment of services, payrolls, records, certificates and any other document related to the donation shall be kept updated and duly filed in a safe place during the term provided through regulation.

At the end of the fiscal year, the agency under whose custody the donation is granted shall perform an evaluation of each recipient entity and shall recommend the action to be taken the following year.

Section 6.—The Secretary of the Treasury shall deduct whatever sum of money is needed for the payment of any debt contracted by said entity with the Government of Puerto Rico, from the donations granted by this Joint Resolution to each entity.

Section 7.—This Joint Resolution shall be known as the "1990 General Budget Joint Resolution".

Section 8.—This Joint Resolution shall take effect July 1, 1989.
