Section 2.—When required by the best interests of the service, the Governor, or the Director Office of the Budget and Management, by his delegation, shall authorize the transfer of

sums between the budget appropriation items of the same body of the Government of Puerto Rico, including the allocations provided for Government Enterprises.

In applying the above, the Office of the Governor, the Office of the Budget and Management, the Planning Board, the Central Communications Office, the Commonwealth Historic Conservation Office, The Public Policy Organization Office and the Environmental Quality Board shall be deemed as a single fiscal unit. The balances or remainders of the appropriations provided in this Joint Resolution shall be available according to the provisions of Act No. 230 of July 23, 1974 as amended, known as the "Puerto Rico Government Accounting Act".

The employees and officials salaries shall be paid according to the provisions of the statute known as the "Uniform Compensation Act", or of any uniform compensation plan approved in the future by this Legislature, and pursuant to the rules and regulations of the Central Personnel Administration Office, to be charged to the appropriations for the departments and agencies consigned in this Joint Resolution, or of any other appropriations authorized for these purposes.

Section 3.—As an independent and additional modality to the alternate compensation methods granted by special statutes, revisions of compensation plans, and raises for merit, and Act No. 89 of July 12, 1979 as amended, known as the "Uniform Compensation Act", each agency is hereby empowered to reserve a maximum of four (4) percent of its operating expense budget all its sources of revenue, so that pursuant to the productivity and efficiency program to be instituted by executive order of the Governor, and the savings achieved in each agency, it shall grant salary raises to its personnel, starting at the lowest levels. All agencies covered by these provisions shall obtain the authorization of the Office of the Budget and Management for the use of the resources that this Act empowers them to reserve through the approval of their executive budget. The raises that are granted pursuant to this Section shall not be subject to the provisions of the abovementioned Act No. 89 The salary raise thus achieved shall be permanent -not a bonus-; it shall not necessarily constitute an adjustment to the salary schedule; shall not be an

impediment for any other benefit that the employee is entitled to under the provisions of other applicable laws; shall be granted by essential work unit which shall consist of one hundred (100) or more employees, except for those agencies that have a lesser number; in which case that shall be the unit; and the agencies are empowered to determine the procedure and criteria to be used in implementing the program, which shall be approved by the Office of the Budget and Management.

Section 4.—The agencies are hereby empowered, with the approval of the Governor or the Director of the Office of the Budget and Management, to enter into agreements with other agencies and/or the municipalities for the rendering of services on the basis of contracting or the matching of municipal funds and those consigned in this Resolution.

Section 5.—The Director of the Budget Management Office is hereby empowered to establish special accounts and authorize advances of funds against said accounts, for the payment of the services of the Electric Power Authority, the Aqueduct and Sewers Authority, the Telephone Authority, the Communications Authority, the Public Buildings Authority, and the General Services Administration's Transportation and Printing Services, and the insurance premiums of the programs of the State Insurance Fund Corporation Programs and the Department of Labor a[n]d Human Resources (unemployment insurance; disability insurance; chauffeurs insurance) programs.

It shall be the obligation of public corporations and enterprises that provide services to the Government, to submit the invoices and billing documents speedily and efficiently, and that of the agencies that use them, to verify and handle the payment of the bills received with due diligence. The Department of the Treasury shall ascertain that the user agencies as well as the public corporations, establish the necessary procedures to liquidate the services that are billed against the established accounts and advances, promptly and correctly. The Secretary of the Treasury is also empowered to make adjustments between the accounts, obligations and

advances of the various agencies and to withhold funds from said accounts to ensure the prompt payment of public services.

Section 6.—Non-government and nonprofit entities which receive funds from the Government of Puerto Rico, shall have the obligation of filing the proposed plan for the use of the appropriations with the Office of the Budget and Management, within a term of thirty (30) days following the approval of the appropriation, and submitting an annual report on the effectiveness of the use of said resources according to said plan, on or before August 28 of each year, until the appropriation is exhausted.

Section 7.—This Resolution shall be known as the "1995 General Budget Joint Resolution["].

Section 8.—This Joint Resolution shall take effect July 1, 1994.

JOINT RESOLUTION
