ineffective the authorization to incur obligations approved by Joint Resolution No. 273 of July 23, 1998; and to authorize the matching of the appropriated funds.

Be it resolved by the Legislature of Puerto Rico:

Section 1.—The sum of seventeen million (17,000,000) dollars, under custody of the Department of the Treasury and from unencumbered funds in the Commonwealth Treasury, is hereby appropriated to the Industrial Development Company to grant industrial incentives and honor the line of credit used in fiscal year 1998-99 to grant industrial incentives, authorized by J.R. No. 273 of July 23, 1998.

Section 2.—The Industrial Development Company is hereby authorized to incur obligations up to the additional sum of fifteen million (15,000,000) dollars to grant industrial incentives in fiscal year 1999-2000.

Section 3.—The authorization to incur obligations granted by virtue of Joint Resolution No. 273 of July 23, 1998, is hereby rendered ineffective.

Section 4.—The obligations incurred pursuant to Joint Resolution No. 273 of July 23, 1998, which is rendered ineffective, as provided in Section 3 of this Joint Resolution shall be honored through the use of the funds consigned in Section 1 of this Joint Resolution. It is also provided that obligations incurred not requiring disbursements in 1998-99 shall be included in the authorization to incur obligations set forth in Section 2 of this Joint Resolution.

Section 5.—The Industrial Development Company is hereby authorized to match the appropriated funds with private, Commonwealth, Municipal or Federal contributions.

Section 6.—This Joint Resolution shall take effect July 1. 1999.

## [Approved June 30, 1999] JOINT RESOLUTION

To provide appropriations for the 1999-2000 fiscal year regular operating expenses of the programs of the various government agencies and instrumentalities of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Branches.

## STATEMENT OF MOTIVES

During the past six years the General Budget of Expenses the Government of Puerto Rico has been directed to designating the greater amount of the resources to government programs that offer direct services to the clientele. The main reason for this is the obligation of the Government to efficiently, attend to the claims of Puerto Ricans for a better quality of life, through the efficient operation of the bodies that are bound to serve them.

This change has resulted in an increase of the 71 percent in 1994 to 81 percent in 1999, an increase of 14.1 percent of the resources destined to programs that provide services to individuals; thus increasing the items that result in a direct benefit to the clientele without having to incur excessive expenses.

Taking into consideration the satisfaction of the clientele, the budget for fiscal year 1999-2000 shall continue to be addressed to their benefit, as in other words focused on results.

Be it resolved by the Legislature of Puerto Rico:

Section 1.—The following sums or parts thereof needed to carry out the purposes set forth below, chargeable to unencumbered funds in the Commonwealth Treasury, are hereby appropriated for regular operating expenses of the programs and agencies of the Executive Branch and the programs of the Judicial and Legislative Branches, for the fiscal year that end June 30, 2000:

Section 2.—When required in the interests of the service the head of the government body may authorize the transfer of sums among the items appropriated to the budget of the same body of the Government of Puerto Rico, including the contributions provided to Government Enterprises, except the transfer of funds consigned for operating expenses of the programs of entities that compose the Departments and Umbrella Agencies, to increase the appropriations to the secretariats or directing units of said Department and Umbrella Agencies.

Likewise, the transfer of funds consigned for the following purposes:

- a. The payment of principal and interest on public debts and other Administrative debts authorized by the Legislature; or of financing plans approved by the Government Development Bank for Puerto Rico.
- b. The payment of public services for water, electricity, telephone and other services provided by public instrumentalities.
  - c. The payment of obligations established by Law.

No transfer of funds shall have the effect of postponing for the following fiscal year the payment of obligations that commit the resources of future budgets beforehand.

No transfer of funds shall be made to grant contracts or assume obligations beyond the fiscal year; and thus, compromise the resources of subsequent fiscal years.

The Department of the Treasury shall submit a report of the transfers made to the Management and Budget Office and to the Committee on Ways and Means of the House of Representatives and the Senate of Puerto Rico, through the Office of the Secretaries of both bodies. The report shall be rendered every three months after the end of the period. [The] report shall consist of two parts: the transfers between appropriations of the same body, and the transfers between appropriations of the fiscal unit, or between the component bodies and programs of an umbrella agency. The reports shall include the following information:

- An itemized list of the transfers of funds within the same body and within the fiscal unit. It shall indicate the appropriation items, as authorized in the General Budget Joint Resolution, affected and those that are increased.

The following Departments and Umbrella Organizations and their components shall be considered as a single fiscal unit for the application of the above provision:

Section 3.—Upon accounting the appropriations provided by this Joint Resolution, the Office of Management and Budget may withhold the corresponding amount for the insurance payment of bonds and fidelity and other insurance contracted by the Bureau of Public Bonds and Insurance of the Department of the Treasury, when applicable. The funds may be transferred directly to the Department of the Treasury to expedite the contracting and payment of said insurance.

Section 4.—Independently and in addition to the alternate compensation methods granted by special legislation, revision thereof, steps for merit and Act No. 89 of July 12, 1979, as amended, known as the "Uniform Compensation Act", each agency is empowered to grant raises in pay to working units whose productivity meets the work goals or surpass the same with less manpower. To implement the above, the increase in personnel of a working unit shall only apply to those cases in which the position of a regular career employee is vacated as defined in Act No. 5 of October 14, 1975, as amended, known as the "Public Services Personnel Act of Puerto Rico", the position is eliminated and is not replaced by the nominating authority in any way; whether by appointment, contracting or administrative assignment, among others. The raise in pay for productivity shall consist of the distribution in equal parts among employees of the working unit of a differential of fifty (50) percent of the salary earned by the employee who vacated the position. For the effects of this Section, the working unit shall be that which is defined in the budget document as Sections of the organization chart of each program. It is further provided, that if another person is recruited; whether by appointment, contract or personnel assignment, or elimination or reduction of the work load of the Unit, said differential shall cease. In addition, before the differential takes effect, the agency shall submit a plan according to the format prescribed by the Office of Management and Budget, and shall obtain its authorizations. It is further provided that resulting savings to the agency shall [be] solely designated to train the personnel of the agency on the improving of the services to its clients.

Section 5.—Salaries officers and employee shall be paid according to the provisions of the Act known as the "Uniform Compensation Act" or of any other uniform compensation plan to be approved in the future by this Legislature pursuant to the rules and regulations of the Central Labor Advisory office the Human Resources Administration Office, and the Office of Management and Budget, chargeable to the appropriations to the departments and agencies consigned in this Joint Resolution, or any other appropriations authorized for these purposes. Any revision of the Classification and Compensation Plans or salary increases shall be adopted and established according to the laws and regulations in effect and subject to the fiscal condition of the agency. Any revision of the classification and compensation plans or any change of the employee's status that results in a salary increase that does not meet the legal requirements and what is indicated above, shall be deemed null from its execution.

Section 6.—Agencies are authorized, with the approval of the Governor or the Director of the Office of Management and Budget, to enter into agreements with other agencies and/or municipalities to provide services based on contracting, or matching of municipal funds and those that are consigned by this Joint Resolution, provided that the contract between the agency and the municipality shall stipulate the authority of the agency to withhold from the payment to the municipalities the sum certified by the Health Insurance Administration from the

insurance premium of the Health Card, whenever the payment becomes due.

Section 7.—The Director of the Office of Management [and] Budget and the Secretary of the Treasury are hereby authorized to open special accounts of the appropriated funds and their surplus, and to authorize advances of funds from said accounts, for the payment of services of the Electric Power Authority, the Aqueduct and Sewer Authority, the Public Building Authority and the Transportation and Printing Services of the General Services Administration, and the insurance premiums of the programs of the State Insurance Fund Corporation and of the Department of Labor and Human Resources (unemployment insurance, disability insurance, chauffeur's insurance); as well as public insurance and the leases with other agencies and third parties.

Corporations and public enterprises that provide services to the Government are bound to submit their invoices and collection vouchers efficiently and promptly and the user agencies are bound to verify and diligently process the payment of the invoices received. The Department of the Treasury shall be aware that both the user agencies as well as the public corporations establish the procedures needed to liquidate the services invoiced against the established accounts and advances, promptly and correctly. The Secretary of the Treasury and the Director of the Office of Management and Budget are also authorized to make adjustments between the accounts, obligations and advances, of entities of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Branches that receive funds through this Joint Resolution and to withhold funds from said accounts to ensure the prompt payment of public services. The surplus from the appropriations for payments to corporations and public enterprises shall be used with priority the payment of public services (current year expenses or former years debts).

Section 8.—Non-Government and nonprofit entities that receive funds the Government of Puerto Rico shall be obliged to

file with the Joint Committee on Legislative Donations the plan for the proposed use of the appropriation within a term of thirty (30) days following the approval thereof, and an annual report on the effectiveness of the use of such resources pursuant to said plan, on or before August 28 of each year, until the appropriation is exhausted.

Section 9.—The balances and surpluses of the appropriations made in this Joint Resolution shall be available according to the provisions of Act No. 230 of July 23, 1974 as amended, known as the "Puerto Rico" Government Accounting Act". These provisions shall not apply to the appropriations made in this Joint Resolution for the payment of the management debt in custody of the Department of the Treasury. The surplus thereof shall be covered into the General Fund upon the closing of fiscal year 1999-2000.

Section 10.—This Joint Resolution shall be known as the General Budget Joint Resolution of the year 2000."

Section 11.—This Joint Resolution shall take effect July 1, 1999.
